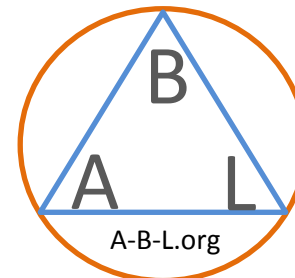
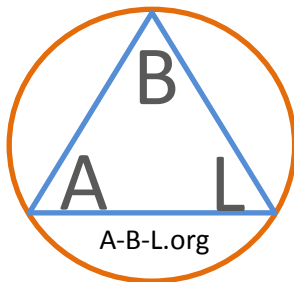

Terms which relate more to the scientific principles of neuroweapons which influence mental processes, as opposed to “on-the-ground” Stasi-style campaigns, are in *italics* as well as ***bold and underline***. Brief outlines of some more important “society” section terms are also included:

Agent provocateur

An **agent provocateur** is a person designed to negatively impact an organization by some variety of possible means, included limited or more extreme approaches. For example, persuading to break laws (including for **blackmail** purposes), causing infighting amongst members, etc.

Ambush

An **ambush** is a long-established military tactic. Combatants take advantage of concealment and the element of surprise to attack unsuspecting attackees. In a neurowarfare context, where covert or overt **ambushes** can be accompanied by **remote neural** influences from great distance, and where **civilians** are not equipped to locate the source or in many cases even discern the presence of a psychological **ambush** attack, **civilians** worldwide are vulnerable to **ambush**. Hence, the need for development and diffusion of **civilian** resilience mechanisms.

Augmented cognition

Augmented cognition involves human-computer interaction and interfaces. Developers use tools and findings of neuroscience, aiming to develop applications which capture human users’ cognitive states in order to drive real-time computer systems. Use of machine “learning” is highly relevant to this.

Biological amplification

Biological amplification in this context refers to a situation where a very weak microwave signal affects signals at the cell level to perpetuate and set up conditions for “refined” manipulation of neural activity which upscales relative to what one might expect given some initially small stimulus. Most often, this term instead involve enzymes, which have shapes which enable them to facilitate or trigger other activities generally within cells.

Blacklisting

A list of persons or organizations designated for special discrimination or boycott; also, to put a person or organization on such a list.

Blackmail

Blackmail is an act, often a crime (the specifics vary by jurisdiction), involving unjustified threats to make a gain (e.g., money or property) or cause loss to another unless a demand is met. Essentially, it is coercion involving threats to reveal substantially true or false information about a person to the public, a family member, or colleagues, or threats of physical/mental harm or criminal prosecution. One example of relevance from recent years includes a sort of "search for Jesus", starting with a "need **blackmail** on everyone".

Blocking harassment

In organized stalking, **blocking harassment** is one (of many) tactics used to wear down a **targeted individual**. In short, in a death-by-a-thousand-cuts sort of strategy, it involves innumerable tiny acts of getting in someone's way. **Blocking harassment** often operates more as an involuntary or semi-voluntary part of **high-tech stalking by proxy** than a purely independent act.

Brain computer interface (BCI)

Generally speaking, this involves some means of reading neural activity (for example an EEG headset) – which is the “brain” part of the **BCI** – combined with machine training on data of neural patterns/process (e.g., different word, image, or thinking process) – which is the computer part of the **BCI**. The computer may also then, via microwave or other stimuli, cause influences to neural activities of the person(s). Basically any process that could be done via computerized instruction (or interface) can theoretically be driven by such process. These technologies can be expected to have a major impact of various types of societal risks, most especially relating to **cognitive liberty**, mind hacking, tyranny avoidance, etc.

Brain fingerprint

Brain fingerprinting is a “non-invasive” neuroscience technique used to determine whether specific information is stored in a subject's brain. It consists of measuring and recording a person's neural wave patterns after the subject is exposed to words, phrases or pictures (whether on a computer screen or via **synthetic telepathy**). Theoretically, it would be possible for some persons to use **brain fingerprinting** to establish “unique resonance frequencies”, i.e., to identify individuals by their neural patterns.

Brain imaging (brain scanner)

Neuroimaging or **brain imaging** refers to various techniques to determine the structure and function of a neural system. Neuroimaging falls into two broad categories: 1) Structural imaging, and 2) Functional imaging. This is not the same as an EEG. Much **civilian** scientific research relating to neural patterns (e.g., evoked potentials) uses such imaging techniques rather than devices which function as an EEG (brain electric activity measurement) device.

Brainwashing

The Oxford Dictionary defines **brainwashing** as follows: “Pressurize (someone) into adopting radically different beliefs by using systematic and often forcible means”. At science.howstuffworks.com the process are divided into three stages: A) Breaking down the self, B) Introducing the possibility of salvation and C) Rebuilding the self.

- A) Breaking down the self: 1) Assault on identity; 2) **Guilt**; 3) Self-betrayal; 4) Breaking point;
- B) The possibility of salvation: 5) Leniency; 6) Compulsion to confess; 7) Channelling of **guilt**; 8) Releasing of **guilt**;
- C) Rebuilding the self: 9) Progress and harmony; 10) Final confession and rebirth. One of the most difficult aspects of reaching out to a brainwashed victim is to help them see that they have indeed been brainwashed.

Thought crimes (in electronic age; also see pre-crime)

In the context of an age where electronic weapons are real, who knows what this could end up meaning. Wrong free thought? Sanctioned thought only? Suppose we just wait to find out ...

Torture (especially no-touch torture)

Torture means any act or omission by which severe pain or suffering, whether physical or mental, is intentionally inflicted on a person (a) for a purpose including (i) obtaining from the person or from a third person information or a statement, (ii) punishing the person for an act that the person or a third person has committed or is suspected of having committed, and (iii) intimidating or coercing the person or a third person, or (b) for any reason based on discrimination of any kind, but does not include any act or omission arising only from, inherent in or incidental to lawful sanctions.

Transcranial magnetic stimulation

Transcranial magnetic stimulation uses a coil near the head to establish a magnetic field which influences neural activities with some degree of precision. It is one of the technologies which demonstrate influences of magnetic and/or electromagnetic influences on neural activities, presumably involving gradients of ions which are most relevant to neural transmission.

Vision reconstruction

As early as 2011, **civilian** researchers at Berkley were encoding models which intercepted brain activity for the purpose of reconstructing visual imagery (in addition to predicting which words would be associated with those images/thoughts). This **civilian** technique was based on fMRI imaging.

War crime

A **war crime** is an act that constitutes a serious violation of the law of war (defined in the statute that established the International Criminal Court) that gives rise to individual criminal responsibility. Examples of **war crimes** include intentionally killing **civilians** or prisoners, **torture**, destroying **civilian** property, taking hostages, perfidy, rape, using child soldiers, pillaging, declaring that no quarter will be given, and using weapons that cause superfluous injury or unnecessary suffering.

Whistleblower

A **whistleblower** is a person who exposes any kind of information or activity that is deemed illegal, unethical, or not correct within an organization that is either private or public. The information of alleged wrongdoing can be classified in many ways: violation of company policy/rules, law, regulation, or threat to public interest/national security, as well as fraud, corruption or tyranny. Some **whistleblowers** get prizes, others get jail.

Zersetzung

Zersetzung (German; variously translated as decomposition, corrosion, undermining, biodegradation or dissolution) was a psychological technique of the East German secret police, the **Stasi**, and was used to silence political opponents. The "measures of **Zersetzung**", defined in the framework of a directive on police procedures in 1976, were used in the context of so-called "operational procedures". They replaced the overt terror of the Ulbricht era.

StingRay (cell phone tower simulator)

A **StingRay** is a cell phone tower simulator which can intercept mobile phone traffic from as many as 10,000 phones at a time. Police routinely claim that they can only be used to intercept metadata, but in fact they can be set to intercept, record and store the communications (which exposes vulnerabilities with respect to the potential lack of paper trail associated with its use).

Subliminal stimuli

Generally speaking, this refers to audio sounds which are too quiet (or some not-too-much-higher sound pitches), or visual presentations which are too brief or otherwise not highly perceptible, for a person to consciously be aware of the sound or audio perception. However, it may be possible to have awareness of a **conditioned** response with **subliminal stimuli**, and to be aware of that stimulus, without consciously perceiving it directly. **Subliminal stimuli** generally does not refer to any stimuli which act directly upon neural processes (as opposed to being through subconsciously processed sensory perceptions), for example through **microwave pulses**.

Subvocalization

Subvocalization, or silent speech, is the internal speech typically made when reading; it provides the sound of the word as it is read. This is a natural process when reading and it helps the mind to access meanings to comprehend and remember what is read. It is among the things which may be driven by **microwave pulses**. Muscle activity to the throat related to **subvocalized** speech can be read with EMG.

Suggestion

Suggestion, in the context of **psychological warfare** in the electronic age (neurowarfare), is the psychological process by which one person guides the thoughts, feelings or behaviour of another. In the context of **psychological warfare** in the electronic age, the power of **suggestion** should be considered as strategically linked to both classic **conditioning** and **microwave mind control**. I am not aware of cognitive or neurally manifested physiological outcomes which are not susceptible to 'training' via these methods.

Synthetic telepathy (a.k.a. Artificial telepathy)

Synthetic telepathy is any technology which enables silent (especially via **microwave pulses**) communication of words, images, or even ideas from one mind to another mind, including individuals who are interfaced with a computer which aids them in assembling (and/or "supplementing") the communication to be transmitted. The other direction of 'communication' for **remote neural monitoring** does not appear to be well understood in **civilian** sources, although related principles are referenced elsewhere in this document. The unabridged version has many relevant scientific references.

Targeted individual

A term that has been used by a variety of people who have been attacked using many of the electronic weapons and techniques described in this glossary. Some believe themselves to be under attack by traditional criminal syndicates, others understand themselves to be targets of suppression by partisan, ideological and/or nationalist plants working under the cover of the security state.

Cause stalking

Cause stalking is a form of organized **stalking**. It is specialized groups who think they are supporting some cause, but are more interested in harassing targets designated by their leaders. The extent to which this is associated with **high-tech stalking by proxy**, at the present time, is not clear.

Civil society

Civil society is elements of society which are independent of the government, such as various media, other **freedom**-related endeavours and religious activity. Social (e.g., charitable) initiatives also often fall in this category.

Civilian

In general, a **civilian** is "a person who is not a member of the military or of a police or firefighting force". For the purpose of this document and related documents, the word "**civilian**" generally refers to the division between publicly accessible materials and those which are protected under classification by the state. The distinction is also relevant in terms of how international treaties define numerous specific rights of **civilians** in a context of conflict.

Coercive persuasion or thought reform

Coercive persuasion or **thought reform** is a coordinated system of graduated coercive influence and behaviour controls designed to deceptively and surreptitiously manipulate and influence individuals, usually in group setting, for the originators of the program to profit in some way (e.g. financially or politically). Using rewards and punishments, efforts are made to establish considerable control over a person's social environment, time, sources of social support, etc. Social isolation is promoted.

COINTELPRO

COINTELPRO (COunter INTELligence PROgram) was a series of covert, and at times illegal, projects conducted by the FBI (USA) to surveil, infiltrate, discredit and disrupt domestic political organizations. The previous historical existence of this program demonstrates a likelihood that political bias exists in some activities of the FBI (and moreover that it could be hidden from view), although this does not constitute any evidence that partisan preference is presently influencing decisions to investigate when ideological and/or partisan characteristics of a victim or aggressor are known.

Cognitive liberty

Cognitive liberty, or the "right to mental self-determination", is the **freedom** of an individual to control his/her own mental processes, cognition and consciousness.

Conspiracy

Conspiracy (civil): an agreement between persons to deceive, mislead or defraud others of their legal rights or to gain an unfair advantage.

Conspiracy (criminal): an agreement between persons to break the law in the future, in some cases having committed an act to further that agreement.

Conspiracy (political): an agreement between persons with goals relating to political power or objectives.

Covert surveillance

Covert surveillance is when someone or something is observed without it being known.

Conditioning

In **conditioning**, an unrelated stimulus eventually becomes linked to some other event, by association. For example, a McDonald's logo (stimulus B) being associated with hunger satiation. This causes a meal association with the logo – maybe you get hungry or even drool a bit shortly after seeing the logo.

DARPA

The Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency (**DARPA**) is an agency of the U.S. Department of Defense responsible for the development of emerging technologies for use by the military. A relevant share of **conspiracy** theories pinpoint **DARPA** as the origins of technologies with potential nefarious applications. It should be noted that much documentation which is both official and publicly available on this subject (not that much), outside of international organizations, originates from this organization. Which is like saying the other ones didn't say anything at all.

Dehumanization

Dehumanization is to make somebody feel or be perceived as less human by taking away his or her individuality, the creative and interesting aspects of his/her personality, or his/her compassion and sensitivity towards others. Among many other things, varying degrees of **dehumanization** may often be a step on the pathway to inhumane actions towards other humans.

Directed conversation

Directed conversation refers to conversations held by complete strangers out in public relating to the target and their personal situations. This is commonly a part of **high-tech stalking by proxy**, with “proxies” of varying independence of thought and action.

Directed energy weapon

A **directed energy weapon** may use: 1) **Electromagnetic radiation**, including radio frequency, microwave, lasers and **masers**; 2) Particles with mass, in particle-beam weapons; 3) Sound, in sonic weapons.

Disinformation

Disinformation is false or inaccurate information spread with the intention to make genuine information useless, and is thus sometimes called black **propaganda**. It is an act of deception and false statements to convince someone of untruth. **Disinformation** should not be confused with misinformation, which is unintentionally false.

Electronic harassment (including no-touch torture)

This is the sum of any and all **torture**, harassment, **psychological torture** and **brainwashing** experiences perpetrated by use of **electromagnetic weapons**. A variety of physiological and mental effects are associated with this term, which should not be confused with cyberstalking.

Schizophrenia

This is a mental health classification which refers to ‘symptoms’ such as ‘false beliefs’, ‘unclear or confused thinking’, ‘hearing voices’, ‘reduced social engagement’, ‘lack of motivation’ a variety of ‘hallucinations’, etc. It is generally synonymous with what you would expect to experience if being harassed by use of electronic weapons, whether or not on the part of any individuals linked to state entities.

Silent sound (a.k.a. sound from ultrasound)

Human hearing ranges from low sounds (like a tuba, as low as the 20-30Hz range) to barely audible high pitched sounds in the 15,000-20,000 Hz range. **Silent sound**, or “sound from ultrasound”, is even higher (more beats per second), and so has much shorter wavelengths than audible sound. This shorter wavelength enables it to have a much narrower beam which can direct sound in a very specific direction rather than being heard widely.

Slander

Slander and defamation are common features of organized **stalking**. In short, **slander** is the communication of a false statement that harms the reputation of an individual person, business, product, group, government, religion or nation. "Libel" generally involves potential payments for damage, whereas in many jurisdictions other criminal law relating to harassment, **blackmail** and other regularly applied legal sanction may be more relevant for similar behaviours which may not fit under the legal definition of "**slander**".

Sleep deprivation

Sleep deprivation is the condition of not having enough sleep, whether caused due to intentional or unintentional disturbances, or also occurring chronically in relation to a variety of medical conditions. Vulnerability to diverse psychological manipulations, in addition to negative immune system strength and other negative health effects, may be caused by **sleep deprivation** regardless of the cause.

Social control

Social control refers to one of two theories: 1) Internalization of norms and values in a society; 2) Practices and institutions which enforce degrees of control or influence in society, such as education, policing and legal institutions, etc.

Stasi

As opposed to popular imagination, the **Stasi** was not itself a secret police peering in on everything. Rather, it mainly processed the enormous amounts of information largely produced by formal and informal informant networks.

Street theater

Street theater when spoken of in an organized **stalking** context refers to carefully scripted harassment performed by neighbours and strangers especially, but can include harassment by family, friends and coworkers. The methods and scripts employed in **street theater** are very subtle, innumerable and almost always are meant to mimic normal life and be symbolically meaningful only to the **targeted individual**.

Psychological torture

Psychological torture is a type of **torture** that relies primarily on psychological effects, and only secondarily on any physical harm inflicted. Many forms of **psychological torture** methods attempt to destroy the subject's normal self-image by removing them from any kind of control over their environment, creating a state of learned helplessness, psychological regression and depersonalization.

Psychological warfare

Of importance, in the present context, is that **psychological warfare** (**neurowarfare**) has expanded from things like flyer drops, radio diffusions and planted media stories, etc. (all of which can be easily tuned out just by turning the radio off, or not reading the dropped flyers, etc.), or even traditional interrogation techniques, to include extensive use of the electronic weapons referred to in this glossary, most especially ones which use pulse-modulated **electromagnetic radiations** to directly influence the minds of targeted populations (see **synthetic telepathy**).

Pulsed energy projectiles

This type of weapon involves the emission of an invisible electromagnetic pulse which, upon contact with the target, ablates the surface and creates a small amount of exploding plasma. This produces a pressure wave that stuns the target and knocks them off their feet, and/or **electromagnetic radiation** that affects nerve cells causing a painful sensation. The technology can also be used as a lethal weapon.

Remote EEG

The concept behind this 'remote EEG' is to scatter off of action potentials or ensembles of action potentials in major central nervous system tracts. This enables to observe and thus decode waveform patterns in neural activity. Wi-Fi and mobile frequency bands are among sources of the electromagnetic bath which may be exploited for purposes of observing patterns in basic properties of waves which have interacted with the brain and electric potential differences which vary as a function of activity.

Remote neural monitoring

Remote neural monitoring primarily refers to use of **remote EEG** to observe semantic, visual, emotional and other neural activity. It is also liable to be combined with incoming (from the perspective of the attackee) **microwave pulses** which cause auditory, visual, emotional and other neural effects.

Sensitization

Sensitization is an example of non-associative learning in which the progressive amplification of a response follows repeated administrations of a stimulus. Sensitization often is characterized by an enhancement of response to a whole class of stimuli in addition to the one that is repeated. For example, repetition of a painful stimulus may make one more responsive to a loud noise.

Electromagnetic radiation/waves

This is the means of transmission of most **neuroweapons**. These "wave particles" are also known as "photons" in the light spectrum. The microwave spectrum of photon frequencies (in the hundreds of MHz to tens of GHz) is where bioeffects are known to exist, in particular with micro pulses tailored as demonstrated in a variety of scientific references included in the unabridged version

Electromagnetic shielding (including Faraday cage)

Electromagnetic shielding is the process of reducing an electromagnetic field in a space by blocking a field with barriers made of conductive and/or magnetic materials.

Electromagnetic weapons

These weapons involve diffusion of **electromagnetic waves** for many purposes, from a) inflicting pain, damage or destruction (**directed energy weapons**) to b) use of the **microwave auditory effect** to remotely communicate sounds directly into people's heads, and c) for **synthetic telepathy**, where in addition to sound, neuro-effective pulse-modulated electromagnetic signals cause other nerve groups to be remotely influenced and thereby transmit ideas, images, emotions, etc. – this can be accompanied by **remote neural monitoring**, which causes bidirectional communication. Potential risks of such technologies include covert behaviour modification by manipulating the minds of persons under attack, an extreme form of **social control** where **cognitive liberty** is threatened.

ELINT

Electronic signals intelligence (**ELINT**) refers to intelligence gathering by use of electronic sensors. Signal identification is performed by analyzing the collected parameters of a specific signal, and either matching it to known criteria or recording it as a possible new emitter.

Emotional cloning (Cloned emotional signatures)

By using computer-enhanced EEGs, scientists can identify and isolate the brain's low-amplitude "emotion signature clusters," synthesize them and store them on another computer. In other words, by studying the subtle characteristic brainwave patterns that occur when a subject experiences a particular emotion, scientists have been able to identify the concomitant brainwave pattern and can now duplicate it. I believe that a **microwave pulse** system is being used as a means of transmitting these cloned neural processes, although a patent relating to **silent sound** manipulations of neuron-level processes in the brain suggests that non-microwave capacities may also exist at present.

Evoked action

An **evoked action** is an action that is evoked neurally, including by decision processes which are essentially conscious and intentional. In one readily demonstrated experiment, the neural activity can be read from an EEG headset of one person, and then used to cause motor movement (e.g., clenching a hand) in a second person by applying an electric stimulus to the surface of the forearm which then passes through skin and other tissues until it reaches a nerve and the stimulus is passed on. This can also be caused

by pulsed EM waves with direct effects on neural activities driving the **evoked action**.

Extremely low frequency waves (ELF)

Extremely low frequency (**ELF**) waves, or “long wave photons”, are known to have discernable naturally occurring effects on humans. The main concern relating to **ELF** waves here is that many persons report their experiences to be resulting from **ELF** waves upon learning about rates of certain frequencies (Hz) of repeating activity in the brain, and thus make the mistake of connecting the dots to conclude that **ELF** waves are responsible for various experiences related to bio and neuro effects of **electromagnetic waves**. While the scientific literature on how **microwave pulses** can cause various auditory, visual, emotional and other effects is a very large literature, research from the **HAARP** program is suggestive to many of the possibility that **ELF** waves from satellites may be directly causing these effects. Health and wellbeing effects relating to **ELF** waves give rise to public complaints near major power transmission lines (50 or 60 Hz) and other situations with unnatural differences in **ELF** exposure.

False flag

False flag describes covert operations designed to deceive, to appear to be carried out by entities, groups or nations other than those who actually planned and executed them.

Fatigue attacks and “electronic caffeine”

Not unlike fast and slow music, associated with high and low energy, a “**fatigue attack**” may be perpetrated using **microwave pulses** consistent with sleep (e.g., the Russian LIDA machine from the 1950s), while “**electronic caffeine**” might then be assumed to involve higher frequency patterns associated with more alertness (may be combined with cardio-related influences).

‘Five Eyes’ intelligence alliance

The ‘**Five Eyes**’ intelligence alliance originates from UKUSA – a secret wartime treaty that says member nations can spy on each others’ population without warrants or limits and share with the spied-on country’s SIGINT agency. It presently includes Australia, Canada, New Zealand, the UK and the USA. Fourier transform A Fourier transform is a mathematical method for breaking down any wave pattern into simpler composite waves. It can break down very complex and “noisy” patterns related to brain activity into identifiable subcomponents, implying the ability to read a variety of neural processes with minimal wave streams.

FOIA

The Freedom of Information Act enables citizens to obtain non-classified information about government activities. Most Western countries have a somewhat functioning variant. Knowing internal terminology being used helps to make good use of the **FOIA** (or equivalent).

Freedom

The Merriam-Webster dictionary includes the following in its definition of **freedom**: 1: the quality or state of being free: as a: the absence of necessity, coercion or constraint in choice or action b: liberation from slavery or

Peace

Peace occurs between heterogeneous social groups and is characterized by a lack of conflict and **freedom** from fear of violence (whether psychological or physical). Commonly understood as the absence of hostility, **peace** often involves compromise, and therefore is initiated with thoughtful listening and communication to enhance and create mutual understanding.

Pedophilia

Pedophilia is a psychiatric disorder in which an adult or older adolescent experiences a primary or exclusive sexual attraction to prepubescent children.

PGP

“Pretty Good Privacy” – **PGP**, is free and unbreakable encryption, available world-wide.

Planting a false memory

Planting a false memory operates first with a **suggestion**, and then diverse efforts to reinforce it as a recollection (refer to warnings in relation to **subvocalization**). The main thing to know is that it is possible, and all the more so if you do not know it.

Plausible deniability

Plausible deniability is the ability for persons (typically senior officials in a formal or informal chain of command) to deny knowledge of or responsibility for any damnable actions committed by others (usually subordinates in an organizational hierarchy) because of a lack of evidence that can confirm their participation, even if they were personally involved in or at least wilfully ignorant of the actions. It can also apply to less exotic situations.

Pre-crime (see thought crime, remote neural monitoring)

The term **pre-crime** is increasingly used in academic literature to describe and criticise the tendency in criminal justice systems to focus on crimes not yet committed.

Propaganda

Propaganda is misleading or biased information aimed at influencing the attitude of a community toward some cause or position.

Psychological evaluation

A **psychological evaluation** is defined as a way of testing people about their behaviour, personality and capabilities to draw conclusions. For present purposes, the relevance is that this may serve as a gateway for "psychiatric reprisal" for speaking of technologies or experiences such as those defined in this glossary, during a scheduled meeting with a licensed psychiatrist. It should be noted that a "psychiatrist" and a "psychologist" are not the same profession, and that the power to relieve an individual of liberty varies enormously across jurisdictions, from places where this basically does not happen to places where it is not needed because some police can just throw almost anyone in jail any time they "want" anyways.

MKULTRA

MKULTRA – sometimes referred to as the CIA's mind control program — was the code name given to an illegal program of **non-consensual human experimentation**, designed and undertaken by the CIA (USA). After Congressional investigation started in the mid-1970s, some 20,000 pages of documents were found which had been filed in the wrong warehouse and so they were not destroyed like the rest of documents related to the program, and hence this entry exists. The names of programs which may have had similar objectives in other countries do not appear to be easily available online.

Neural oscillation

Neural oscillation is rhythmic or repetitive neural activity in the central nervous system. Neural tissue can generate oscillatory activity in many ways, driven either by mechanisms within individual neurons or by interactions between neurons. A common misunderstanding of the term “brain waves” is that it refers to, say, emitting photons from the brain, whereas in fact this refers more so to observed patterns in neural activity which may be represented over time in wave forms (also see Fourier transforms, a type of mathematical transformation).

Neuroweapons

Any weapon that targets the nervous system or brain functioning of a target. Traditionally these may have involved things like drugs or neurotoxins involved in chemical warfare, but now this primarily refers to **electromagnetic weapons** with physiological and/or neural effects.

Non-consensual human experimentation

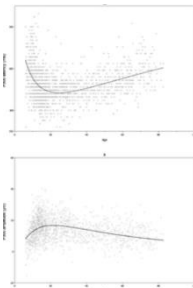
Non-consensual human experimentation refers to individuals who are the subject of study for scientific purposes, including military and **social control** purposes, sometimes without their knowledge, but most certainly without their consent. In the post-WWII era, this includes occurrences where people with disabilities and/or who were otherwise vulnerable were used, as research subjects, against their will and in many cases with little or no process to escape their situation or find means of redress.

Nuremberg Code

After the horrors of WWII, most nations on the planet readily agreed on numerous sets of principles, one of which banned involuntary experimentation along with some set of presumed minimum standards for ethical research practices when human were involved.

P300 (neuroscience)

The **P300** (P3) wave is a specific event-related potential (ERP) component elicited in the process of decision making. It is named for the fact that the peak activity linked to a decision event occurs about 300 ms after the stimulus. This signal is caused by millions of neurons firing together in a synchronised fashion. This is among earlier (historically) explicitly identified neural patterns.

Fusion centre (USA)

Fusion centres involve significant information compiling across numerous security-related departments in the USA. Many of these centres were jointly created between 2003 and 2007. A two-year senate investigation found that "the **fusion centers** often produced irrelevant, useless or inappropriate intelligence reporting to DHS, and many produced no intelligence reporting whatsoever."

Gagged person

A **gagged person** is whispered lies and **slander**, by a perpetrating entity, about a **targeted individual**. If the **gagged person** believes the lies, they become angry at the **targeted individual** and are recruited into the targeting. **Gagged persons** are threatened, either subtly or aggressively, so they will not advise the **targeted individual** of either the negative things they have been told or the identity of the perpetrator.

Gaslighting

Gaslighting is a form of mental abuse in which a victim is manipulated into doubting their own memory, perception and sanity. It may involve small progressive changes over time, which a perpetrator may then claim never happened, with the observation of change then being proposed as evidence of some mental illness. It is common in early stages of **brainwashing**.

Guilt

The cognitive or emotional experience of **guilt** occurs when a person believes or realizes – accurately or not – that he or she has compromised his/her own standards of conduct or has violated a moral standard and bears significant responsibility for that violation. It is closely related to the concept of remorse. In a context of **psychological warfare** in the electronic age, it is common to try to figure out your values so the perpetrating entity can elicit a sense of **guilt**, to then be used in the application of positive and negative stimuli (sticks and carrots) in processes of **conditioning** and **brainwashing**.

HAARP (High Frequency Active Auroral Research Program)

HAARP was an ionospheric research program jointly funded by the U.S. Air Force, the U.S. Navy, the University of Alaska and **DARPA**, designed and built by BAE Advanced Technologies (BAEAT). Among the numerous findings of the research program is the ability to generate extremely low frequency **electromagnetic waves** by modulated heating of the auroral electrojet.

High-tech stalking by proxy

High-tech stalking by proxy involves many practices described in the extended entry (not in this document) on organized **stalking**. The "by proxy" part refers to either voluntary or involuntary speech and/or action caused by

influences, generally transmitted via **microwave pulses**, which are followed through on – with lots of grey area from voluntary to involuntary (including as a function of the extent of **conditioning** and/or **brainwashing**, or different vulnerabilities to **mind influencing technologies**).

Informed consent

Informed consent refers to having full and ongoing information about anything which might be expected to be of concern if undergoing a medical procedure or a clinical trial.

Inner voice cloning

Inner voice cloning is a process where those participating via **synthetic telepathy electronic harassment** (including **remote neural monitoring**) may copy your **subvocalized** inner voice, speaking to you “in your own first person” (or, perhaps, on your behalf) through **microwave pulses** targeting the audio cortex.

Innuendo

Statement A logically implies statement B if and only if the truth of A guarantees the truth of B. **Innuendo** occurs when statement A suggests the truth of statement B, without logically implying it. **Innuendo** can take many forms, but here I refer mainly to any statement which indirectly suggests that someone has done something immoral, improper, etc., or perhaps which dehumanizes them or otherwise contributes to some form of attack.

Interferometry

Interferometry uses of the principle of superposition to combine waves to find some property that indicates the original state of the waves. This works because when two waves with the same frequency combine, the resulting intensity pattern is determined by the phase difference between the two waves. Most interferometers use light or some other form of **electromagnetic wave**.

Laser microphone

A **laser microphone** is a surveillance device that uses a laser beam to detect sound vibrations in a distant object, for example by observing differences in light reflections which depend on bouncing sound waves on a glass window.

Masers

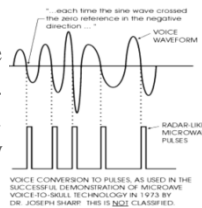
First built in 1953, a **maser** (acronym for "microwave amplification by stimulated emission of radiation") is a device that produces coherent **electromagnetic waves** through amplification by stimulated emission.

Magnetophosphenes

Magnetophosphenes are flashes of light (phosphenes) that are seen when one is subjected to a changing magnetic field – this is experienced by some people when in an MRI, for example. This changing field causes current within the retina or visual cortex, resulting in the illusion of light. The effect was first reported by d'Arsonval (1896).

Microwave auditory effect (related to synthetic telepathy)

This refers to the very surprising fact that microwave **electromagnetic waves** can be perceived as sound in the brain. Since we can see light, but not hear it, this is very surprising. The effect was first reported by persons working in the vicinity of radar transponders during World War II.



Microwave mind control (see brainwashing and electronic weapons)

This involves the use of microwave (electronic) weapons, namely those used to speak into your mind, engage in **remote neural monitoring**, and those which may modulate moods, thought processes and other behaviours and/or physiological responses (in conjunction with **conditioning**) to attempt to sequentially assert control over an individual, to the point that they are essentially brainwashed, or at least willing to submit to any or all directives they are given (which may involve **brainwashing** or use of **conditioning** for them to believe that they are ‘powerful’ or somehow doing good when engaged in such **psychological torture**).

Microwave Doppler movement measuring device

The Life Assessment Detector System (LADS) by VSE Corp., a **microwave Doppler movement measuring device**, can detect human body surface motion, including heartbeat and respiration, at ranges up to 135 feet (41.15 meters). The LADS consists of a sensor module, a neural network module, and a control/monitor module. The sensor module is an x-band (10 GHz) microwave transceiver with a nominal output power of 15 milliwatts, operating in the continuous wave (CW) mode.

Microwave pulses

A microwave is a photon, like light, but a different frequency. In the sense of being “pulses”, imagine something pulsing for 10 milliseconds, ten times a second. E.g., from 0-10 ms, 100-110 ms, and so on up to 900-910 ms, and continuing on. It could be a lot more refined than that and tailored in diverse other ways. In addition to time, a common unit of measure is volts per square metre. Different photon wavelengths/frequencies and pulsed combinations have physiological and especially neural effects. ”Microwave hearing”, a.k.a. the **microwave auditory effect**, is also caused by **microwave pulses**.

Millimeter waves (and weapons)

The millimeter-wave region of the electromagnetic spectrum is usually considered to be the range of wavelengths from 10 millimeters (0.4 inches) to 1 millimeter (0.04 inches). **Millimeter waves** travel solely by line-of-sight, and are blocked by building walls and attenuated by foliage. Propagation is limited to a few kilometers in normal conditions.

Mind influencing technologies

This refers to applications of electronic weapons, often in association with on-the-ground **stalking by proxy**. Markets in medical and commercial devices are also active in this area, but for present purposes the primary concern pertains to uses of electronic weapons as defined in this glossary.
